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Mobile Shelters and Planning Permission

- * The courts have ruled that planning permission is not required for a mobile field shelter as long as it is not permanently fixed to the ground and is easily moveable
- * Please remember that sometimes land may need permission for change of use (ie from agricultural to grazing horses)
- * In August 2001 a horse owner was issued with a Court Order to remove his mobile field shelter from an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. He decided to appeal against the decision and the result of the appeal was a victory for mobile field shelter owners all over the country
- * As a result of the appeal decision a precedent was set and mobile field shelters cannot be legally removed by Court Order or Petition
- * Case Law has now been set, something which is very important in the consideration of planning applications
- * Any council considering court action against the siting of a mobile field shelter will in future be required to refer to past precedent
- * If in any doubt whatsoever regarding the requirements of planning permission contact your local planning officer and refer to the precedent set

Siting Your Shelter

- * Choose a reasonably flat, well drained area – if your unit is to be built in situ it will only be as level as the ground it is built on
- * Site against prevailing wind – also bear in mind you may need additional staking points in gale force winds
- * Horses will use the outside as well as inside for shelter – leave enough space for them to move easily around all sides
- * If you intend dividing paddocks it often works out more economical to fence to front centre of a twin unit that has either a fixed or gated partition rather than purchase two separate shelters
- * A mobile field shelter cannot be fixed down permanently therefore it is especially important to get it insured – the NFU and similar companies offer comprehensive cover against storm damage etc
- * Invest in a heavy duty unit – cheaper, lighter units will not stand the test of time – we have replaced many of these inferior units due to poor quality build and materials, storm damage, etc

Which Mobile Field Shelter? - 20 point Checklist

- 1 Timber pressure treated to BS5658 - protecting against infestation and rot for up to 20 years
- 2 Frame constructed from stress grade smooth planed C16 4"x2" timber
- 3 Shiplap cladding (much easier to repair than tongue and groove) – we use the very best top grade European redwood from sustained sources
- 4 Panels bolted together with heavy duty coach bolts - not nailed (higher resale value if bolted)
- 5 Four-sided galvanised steel skid units support the whole of the structure when towing
- 6 Tow points both ends – beware of fixed tow bars that only allow you to tow from one end
- 7 Light and easy to manage tow straps and shackles - fully tested to the latest standards – safety test certificate available with each set of straps
- 8 Set of four ground pegs with option to upgrade to extra long, heavier set
- 9 Gale release/summer vent panels incorporating fixed open louvered vent – additional protection against storm damage also invaluable for extra air flow in hot weather
- 10 Air vents included - constant fresh air flow is vital to the health of your animals
- 11 Galvanised strips to external corners – protects against chewing and rubbing
- 12 Galvanised protection strips to roof edges – extra weather protection to your roof
- 13 Top quality heavy duty coach bolts, screws, roof fixings etc all included
